### HTML - Tables

#### Exercise #10

You will be adding a simple organizational table to the Edgar Allan Poe page you created in Exercise 8.

1. Open the **exercise8.htm** document you created in Exercise 8 and save it as **exercise10.htm**
2. The table you will be creating will hold a list of poems and a list of short stories by Poe. It should look similar to this:

Poems by Poe	Stories by Poe

Add the following below the list of stories.

3. Check your work with Internet Explorer. You should see a table with four cells. The top row should have a gray background color.
4. Using the table from Step 2 as a reference, add the appropriate headings and content to each of the cells. To help you identify where the information should go, look at where the "heading here" and "content here" areas are. Ensure that the story and poems each appear as an unordered list.
5. Remove the list of stories that appears above the table as well as the horizontal rule. Since this information is now neatly provided within our table, which also separates the page, it makes sense to remove these.

6. Use the illustration below to ensure your page has been correctly completed.
