## AN INTRODUCTION

### HTML – Hyperlinks with Relative URLs

#### Exercise #14

In this exercise you will be creating an index page that will allow you (and me) easy access to all of the exercises you have completed so far. This index page will include relative hyperlinks to all of your exercises as well as your assignments. Remember, relative links describe the location of one document in relation to another. That means, they DO NOT use absolute paths such as:

'A: \\' OR 'C: \\' OR 'http: //' – These indicate the absolute location of a document, either on the A drive (usually the floppy drive), the C drive (usually the hard disk) or on the World Wide Web (usually http).

1. Open the template.htm document you created in Exercise 5 and save it as **index.htm**. Ensure that this and all of the exercises you have completed reside in the **web\_dev\_exercises** folder, except for Exercise 13 which should be in the **horror\_authors** folder within the **web\_dev\_exercises** folder.
2. Add the required information to the page so it appears the same as the sample below. Depending on whether you are taking the course through Continuing Education, Distance Education or some other form, the number and names of assignments may vary. Please display the correct assignments for your course here. Assignments not related to the construction of a web page (creation of Design Document assignments as an example) won't be included here.

*Ensure that the name of each exercise and assignment is a functioning relative link that works properly. Each link should open in a new window.*

*Note that if the names of the exercises listed below are not the same as what you have please use the current exercise names as they correspond to the exercise numbers.*
