HTML – Web Input Form

Exercise #16

Web forms allow you a way to interact with the users of your website. Forms are used to collect information, provide feedback and are an integral part of on-line shopping sites. In this exercise, you will be creating a survey page to add to the Classic Horror Authors web site.

1. Open **authors_poe.htm** from **Exercise 15** and save it as **authors_survey.htm**
2. Where the authors name appears change it to: **Classic Horror Authors Survey**.
3. You will next create a table to contain all the parts of the survey. The table has a single column and 9 rows. Use the following for the rest of the table attributes/values.

4. Using the sample at the end of the exercise as a guide, add the following survey information to the table. The type of input element is noted beside each section. **DO NOT** include that text in your form.
